



## SCORING

- Record the **COLOURS** of the two teams playing in the first two columns under the "FIRST HALF" (Note: sometimes the referee will shorten the actual colour from a 2-syllable colour to a 1-syllable colour e.g. "red" instead of "orange").
- The scorer's **UNIFORM NO.** (high-lighted in yellow) is recorded in the first column under the appropriate team colour and the points scored are recorded in the adjacent column.
- The **SCORES** should be sequentially running totals for each team.
- Stagger the scores when one team scores and then the other as in the example to the right.
- When a player is awarded 1 or more foul shots, record the shooter's uniform number under the appropriate team colour. If he/she has two foul shots, then repeat the shooter's uniform number. If the shooter scores the foul shot, record 1 point to the sequential running score. If the shooter misses the foul shot, record a "-" in the adjacent column.
- If the running score reaches the end of the column in the same half, record the colours of the two teams playing in the next two columns and continue recording the score.

- At the start of the second half, record the colours of the two teams playing under the "SECOND HALF" columns and transfer the score at the end of the first half in the top row.
- Continue recording the score in the same way you did during the first half.
- If a winner is declared at the end of the second half, record the two scores in the appropriate boxes on the right-hand side of the score sheet.
- A tie stands during regular league play; however during playoffs extra periods may be necessary to determine the winner so use the "EXTRA PERIOD" column to record the score. As before, record the colours of the two teams playing and transfer the scores at the end of the second half to the top row of the "EXTRA PERIOD" column.
- At the conclusion of the game, record the two scores in the appropriate boxes on the right-hand side of the score sheet.

### TEAM and INDIVIDUAL FOULS

16. The scorekeeper must record any fouls assessed by either team under the appropriate team section.
17. If a player is assessed a foul, then it needs to be recorded as a cumulative **TEAM FOUL** and an individual player **FOUL** as in the example to the right.
18. Use "X" for fouls assessed in the first half and "O" for fouls assessed in the second half.
19. Once a player reaches 4 fouls, we bring it to the attention of the coach of the offending player so they can take appropriate actions (i.e. sub the player out or warn the player they are in foul trouble).
20. Once a player is assessed 5 fouls, that player is "fouled out" and cannot re-enter the game.
21. Once a team reaches 6 fouls, we inform the coach of the offending team so they are aware their next foul will result in a bonus situation for the other team.
22. Once the team reaches 7 fouls, the other team is in "bonus" and is awarded a foul shot.

23. Scorekeepers must also keep track of any **TIME OUTS** called by either team.
24. Similar to fouls, time outs called in the first half are denoted by an "X" and those called in the second half are denoted by an "O".
25. In EXTRA PERIODS, only one TIME OUT is allowed even if there are multiple extra periods. This is to ensure games finish within a reasonable period of time to keep the overall game schedule on track.
